(1) Hyper- or hypopigmented skin on the chest and neck; tightened neck skin prevents full neck extension (platysmas sign). (2) Reduced oral aperture with scattered telangiectasias on the face, lips, and tongue; additional lesions may occur on the buccal mucosa.

Online Figure B. Calcinosis cutis in a patient with systemic sclerosis. (1) Visible dystrophic calcium deposits on the forefinger. (2) Radiography showing calcium deposits; this is helpful when the diagnosis is less certain.
