Dear Chairman Spratt:

We urge you to support the Administration's FY 2010 Budget proposal that assumes the 'rebasin' of Medicare physician payments. This proposal recognizes the need to replace the sustainable growth rate (SGR) and avert the serious access crisis that looms as physicians face drastic payment cuts in the coming decade due to this failed formula.

The Administration's Budget essentially resets the Medicare physician payment baseline. It includes \$329.6 billion over 10 years "to account for expected Medicare payments to physicians." This assumes a more realistic baseline for physician spending and is the Administration's "best estimate of what the Congress has done in recent years." The new baseline would recognize the reality of future Medicare spending on physicians' services. The existing baseline unrealistically assumes drastic physician payment cuts in the future because of the flawed nature of the SGR formula and the budget gimmicks that have been used to avert the previous cuts.

Congress and the physician community now confront a 21 percent cut on January 1, 2010 and cuts for the next several years thereafter totaling 40 percent. To avert these future cuts that threaten patient access to care, Congress will have to intervene, thereby continually ignoring the current baseline. Since 2003, Congress has interceded six times to legislatively ignore the baseline and stop pending cuts. It is now clear that the current physician payment baseline is no longer useful in that it paints a false picture of actual Medicare spending.

Rebasin the physician payment baseline would reflect projected Medicare spending and would also represent a more realistic and transparent approach to addressing rising health care costs. After all, the primary purpose of a baseline is to provide policymakers a clear forecast of projected spending and taxpayer obligations.

Most importantly, rebasin would facilitate the passage of legislation to permanently reform the Medicare physician payment system to preserve the delivery of high quality, cost-effective care for our nation's seniors and disabled patients. **Therefore, as proposed in the Administration's Budget, we strongly urge the Budget Committee to support the adoption of a new Medicare baseline for physician payments in the FY 2010 Budget Resolution.**
