

## **When giving *Your Future Is Family Medicine* presentation:**

- Consider using this presentation at your next Family Medicine Interest Group event, new student orientation, clerkship orientation, summer preceptorship activity, medical student conference, chapter meeting and/or residency fair.
- Be sure you are in touch with the unique needs and specific concerns of your audience and craft your objectives accordingly.
- The CD-ROM offers a broad range of talking points and visuals. Draw from this resource information that best suits your objectives, the venue for the presentation, audience size and time frame.
- Don't attempt to cover too much ground in one session. Keep in mind that your audience is likely to recall no more than four to six key points from your presentation.
- Personalize the material to reflect your style and experiences. Make changes to the slides so that the visuals compliment your presentation. Feel free to change background color and add images, graphics and other elements.
- Encourage questions from the audience throughout your presentation. Also, build in time for group discussion at the end of the presentation. Keep track of the nature of the questions and schedule additional activities that allow students and family physicians to discuss topics/questions more in depth.
- Utilize the pre- and post-assessment tools provided with the CD to collect feedback and refine your presentation.
