Dear Representatives Guthrie and Richmond,

On behalf of the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) and the 124,900 family physicians and medical student members we represent, I write to express our support for the Sports Medicine Licensure Clarity Act of 2017 (HR 302).

HR 302 establishes common-sense medical liability protections for athletic trainers and sports medicine physicians who travel to a secondary state with athletes and athletic teams. If enacted, sports medicine professionals will be able to provide high-quality health care and operate within their capacities without unnecessary financial or legal burdens.

The AAFP strongly believes that patients benefit when they have a continuous and consistent point of care, such as a physician who knows their history. That principle also applies for athletes and sports teams. We believe the Sports Medicine Licensure Clarity Act of 2017 is a reasonable policy to provide flexibility for physicians, and to ensure athletes receive high-quality medical care.
