1 Adding Diversity to the American Academy of Family Physicians Board of Directors 2 3 Submitted by: Megan Guffey, MD, IMG Sabesan Karupprah, MD, FAAFP, IMG 4 5 Ambar Kulshreshtha, MD, FAAFP, IMG 6 7 WHEREAS, The American Academy of Family Physicians has a Board of Directors that furthers 8 the mission of the organization, and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Board of Directors should more closely mirror the makeup of the overall organization, and 11 12 WHEREAS, traditionally members of the member constituencies have been under represented on 13 14 the Board of Directors, and 15 WHEREAS, this has already been remedied by adding the new physician, resident, and student 16 17 directors to the Board of Directors, now, therefore, be it 18 19 RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians add one seat to the Board of 20 Directors for the four under-represented constituency leader groups (e.g. International Medical 21 Graduate, Lesbian, Gay, Transgender, Minority, and Women), and be it further 22 23 RESOLVED, That the new board seat for under-represented constituency leader groups (e.g. International Medical Graduate, Lesbian, Gay, Transgender, Minority, and Women) would be for a 24 25 one-year term, elected at the National Conference of Constituency Leaders meeting annually in a 26 similar fashion as the new physician board member.

11 12 13	WHEREAS, The mission of the American Academy of Family Physicians is to improve the health of patients, families, and communities, and
14 15 16	WHEREAS, patients in rural communities face unique healthcare challenges including limited access to care, higher rates of poverty, and lower rates of education, and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, family physicians in rural communities face unique challenges including having limited resources, and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, Native Americans are underrepresented in healthcare and more proportionally live in rural communities, and
23 24 25	WHEREAS, family physicians in rural communities have unique challenges in collaboration with and competition from nurse practitioners and physician assistants, and
26 27 28	WHEREAS, family physicians in rural communities may be isolated and have fewer opportunities for interactions with colleagues, and
29 30 31	WHEREAS, family physicians that serve rural communities are often underrepresented in state chapter leadership, at the Congress of Delegates, and on the national Board of Directors, and
32 33 34	WHEREAS, a rural family medicine constituency could help to engage more physicians at the state and national levels, now, therefore, be it
35 36	RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians create a Rural Family Medicine Constituency at the AAFP National Conference of Constituency Leaders.

8	WHEREAS, The growing diversity of the American Academy of Family Physicians includes those
9	physicians who may not identify within the gender binary, and
10	
11	WHEREAS, all people share the real human need for access to safe restroom facilities, and
12	
13	WHEREAS, being required to use a public facility that does not correspond with gender identity is
14	a health issue that negatively affects transgender or gender-variant people by increasing their risk
15	of sexual, verbal, and physical harassment and violence, and
16	
17	WHEREAS, the Gay And Lesbian Medical Association has a long history of providing gender
18	neutral bathrooms at national conferences by ensuring either non gendered single-stall restrooms
19	or changing existing signage of multi-stall restrooms, now, therefore, be it
20	
21	RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) ensure at least one (or
22	more) gender neutral restroom stall(s) at all national AAFP events that is not a participant's hotel
23	room, and be it further
24	
25	RESOLVED, That all American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) event restrooms including
26	gender neutral restroom(s) be labeled on the AAFP event mobile application map.

8 9 10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, National Conference of Constituency Leaders Resolution No. 4004 Better Parental Leave Policies for Family Physicians was adopted by the NCCL and under review in the Commission on Health of the Public /Science which states, "That the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) support a minimum of 12 weeks paid leave for primary caregivers for a newborn or adopted child, including family physicians and residents, and support an optional extension of this leave as unpaid time off," and
14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, current AAFP personnel policy allows staff 6 weeks of paid maternity leave for AAFP staff members which is inconsistent with Resolution No. 4004, and
18 19 20	WHEREAS, we feel that the wellbeing of our staff is as important as the wellbeing of our members, and
21 22 23	WHEREAS, the AAFP non-clinical policy statements may not always align with AAFP internal practices and personnel policies, now, therefore, be it
24 25	RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) review AAFP personnel policies and ensure continued alignment with AAFP non-clinical policy statements.

1 Opportunities to Encourage Graduating Residents to Maintain Membership Within the American 2 Academy of Family Physicians 3 4 Submitted by: Alex Mroszczyk-McDonald, MD, FAAFP, New Physician 5 Po-Yin Samuel Huang, MD, Minority 6 7 WHEREAS, 94% of graduating family medicine residents are entering into employment contracts 8 with hospitals and medical groups, and 9 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) membership was traditionally 10 11 comprised of predominantly small and solo practicing family physicians, and 12 13 WHEREAS, 89% of AAFP's new to practice physicians are now employed, and 14 15 WHEREAS, a quarter of members of the AAFP are new physicians who are within seven years of 16 graduating from their residency, and 17 18 WHEREAS, many new physicians may fail to see the benefit of maintaining AAFP membership 19 after graduation and find the cost prohibitive or at least a barrier to continuing their membership, 20 and 21 22 WHEREAS, AAFP's dues reduction is offered only to resident members who convert to active 23 membership upon graduation from their programs, and 24 25 WHEREAS, isolation, burnout, and poor wellness are major contributors to job dissatisfaction especially in new practicing physicians, now, therefore, be it 26 27 28 RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) explore opportunities to 29 specifically reach out to and engage graduating residents and recently graduated family physicians 30 on the benefits of AAFP membership for physicians in an employed setting, and be it further 31 32 RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians develop language to help residents 33 negotiate for employer to support state and national specialty society membership dues within their 34 compensation/CME package, and be it further 35 36 RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) expand the discounted dues program to graduated resident members who continuously maintain membership for the first 37 38 three years following completion of their family medicine residency and increase visibility of this option on the AAFP website, as well as better publicize this information among graduating 39 40 residents.
