2021 Report of the Reference Committee on Organization & Finance

ITEM NO. 1: RESOLUTION NO. 4001: ALLOCATE FUNDING TO ALLOW ALL NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF CONSTITUENCY LEADERS CO-CONVENERS TO ATTEND THE AAFP CONGRESS OF DELEGATES

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians allocate funding (approximate cost: \$2,100 per alternate delegate (total \$4,200 annually) for all eight member constituency co-conveners to attend the annual Congress of Delegates as alternate delegates.

The reference committee heard testimony all in support of the resolution. Members believe the addition of other co-conveners would provide more equitable leadership opportunities for all elected co-conveners by allowing them to experience the Congress of Delegates (COD). There was testimony seeking clarification about the role of the additional National Conference of Constituency Leaders (NCCL) co-conveners who would attend COD as there may be implications regarding changes to existing bylaws. The reference committee agreed that expanding the opportunity for additional NCCL co-conveners to experience COD does provide leadership development opportunities and helps prepare them for the following year's NCCL. To better reflect the intent of the resolution and address concerns regarding the role of the additional co-conveners that would attend COD, the reference committee recommended adding more specificity regarding who would be eligible as well as the capacity to which they would attend COD.

RECOMMENDATION: The reference committee recommends that Substitute Resolution No. 4001 which reads as follows be adopted in lieu of Resolution No. 4001:

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians allocate funding for the two member constituency co-conveners, who are not elected as member constituency alternate delegates, to attend Congress of Delegates as general registrants in the same calendar year.

ITEM NO. 2: RESOLUTION NO. 4002: INCREASING DIVERSITY ON THE AAFP BOARD OF DIRECTORS THROUGH THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF CONSTITUENCY LEADERS

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians allow eligible active IMG, LGBTQ, minority, and/or women members in good standing to seek nomination as a candidate for the AAFP Board of Directors through the National Conference of Constituency Leaders (NCCL) through a process to be developed by the Commission on Members and Membership Services in conjunction with a group of NCCL past and current leaders.

All testimony provided was in support of the resolution. Those who testified indicated challenges in pursuing board of director positions due to circumstances unique to marginalized groups under the existing system. To continue to provide diversity in the leadership pipeline, which is a primary purpose of National Conference of Constituency Leaders (NCCL), members testifying believed NCCL should also be enhanced to provide a nomination pathway for board of director positions. The reference committee acknowledged there are structural barriers that may make it difficult for board of director nominees to be more diverse and representative. However, the resolution as written, cannot be adopted without a bylaws change in how board candidates are nominated. Current bylaws indicate the only nomination pathway is through nomination by the member's constituent chapter. Therefore, the reference committee recommended a substitute resolution that would more adequately reflect the process required to implement this change.

RECOMMENDATION: The reference committee recommends that Substitute Resolution No. 4002 which reads as follows be adopted in lieu of Resolution No. 4002.

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians bylaws be amended to allow eligible active IMG, LGBTQ, minority, and/or women members in good standing to seek nomination as a candidate for the AAFP Board of Directors through the National Conference of Constituency Leaders (NCCL), through a process developed by the Commission on Members and Membership Services, in conjunction with a group of NCCL past and current leaders.

ITEM NO. 3: RESOLUTION NO. 4003: CULTIVATING A DIVERSE AND LGBTQ-INCLUSIVE FAMILY MEDICINE WORKFORCE

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians expand upon the 25 x 2030 Student Choice Collaborative by advocating for a special focus on minority groups including, but not limited to, the Black, Latinx, Native American and transgender/gender non-conforming communities, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians ensures representation of underrepresented in medicine physicians through mentorship, recruitment, and retention of the Black, Latinx, Native American and transgender/gender expansive communities in positions of leadership in the Academy.

The reference committee heard testimony in support of the resolution to focus on minority groups to be included in the America Needs More Family Doctors: 25x2030 Collaborative, which the AAFP is a partner organization. Not only would it strengthen the workforce pipeline, but also provide diverse representation. The reference committee believed this will help advance the importance of workforce diversity for the specialty of family medicine, and consequently, better care for patients. Because the AAFP is a member and not solely responsible for the America Needs More Family Doctors: 25x2030 Collaborative, the reference committee recommended a substitute resolution reflecting its role.

RECOMMENDATION: The reference committee recommends that Substitute Resolution No. 4003 which reads as follows be adopted in lieu of Resolution No. 4003:

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians advocate to expand upon the 25 x 2030 Student Choice Collaborative to include a special focus on minority groups including, but not limited to, the Black, Latinx, Native American and transgender/gender non-conforming communities, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians ensures representation of underrepresented in medicine physicians through mentorship, recruitment, and retention of the Black, Latinx, Native American and transgender/gender expansive communities in positions of leadership in the Academy.

ITEM NO. 4: RESOLUTION NO. 4004: RENAMING THE LGBT PHYSICIANS CONSTITUENCY

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians rename the LGBT member constituency to the LGBTQ+ member constituency, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians define the membership of the constituency as "those who self-identify as LGBTQ+ or who are supportive of LGBTQ+ issues."

The testimony presented to the reference committee was in favor of adopting the resolution. Those who testified in support of the resolution believed that the name change would be more inclusive of all groups of sexual minorities which is not reflected in the current name of the member constituency. Members recognized the value it adds and thatit would also reflect the patients they serve. The reference committee agreed with the benefits of the name change and were in support of the change to be more inclusive of all sexual minorities.

RECOMMENDATION: The reference committee recommends that Resolution No. 4004 be adopted.

ITEM NO. 5: RESOLUTION NO. 4005: Helping

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians directly engage with AAFP members in the United States who were previously refugees and others who are interested to create a working group that collects data to establish how many refugees in the United States are family physicians, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the American Academy of Family Physicians charge this working group to create initiatives and evaluate opportunities to partner with states or organizations like the Welcome Back Initiative and Women's Initiative for Self-Empowerment to directly impact and benefit refugee physicians.

The reference committee heard testimony in support of the resolution. Those who testified believe this is an issue with broad impact. By assisting this group, who already has the education and experience as family physicians from their home country, the AAFP can help with the expected workforce shortage, particularly in rural and underserved areas, and help with providing a diverse and representative workforce. Testimony was also provided to request that asylum seekers be

1	included as they are facing similar issues. The reference committee supported the spirit of the
2	resolution but recommended providing more clarity on how the AAFP can achieve this initiative.

4	RECOMMENDATION: The reference committee recommends Substitute Resolution No. 4005
5	which reads as follows be adopted in lieu of Resolution No. 4005.

7	RESOLVED: That the American Academy of Family Physicians create a working
8	group to investigate issues and barriers family physicians face who are refugees or
9	asylum seekers and explore initiatives and opportunities to partner with states or
10	organizations like the Welcome Back Initiative and Women's Initiative for Self-
11	Empowerment to directly impact and benefit refugee or asylum seeking family
12	physicians.
