- US: Providence, RI
- International: Kenya, Mexico

Fellowship Length: 2 years

Time abroad: 2-3 months/ year, total 4-6 months

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Florida State University



- We accept 2 fellows per year
- 12 month program (July 2021-July 2022)
- 6 months abroad (Honduras, Egypt, Papua New Guinea, Kenya)
- 6 months in Ft. Myers, FL as faculty at FSU Family Medicine Residency at Lee Health

Schedule is divided into 3 months at a time in each location, alternating between 2 fellows

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APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Contact program/fellowship director Dr. Gitu at Alfred.Gitu@leehealth.org
- Submit application including CV and letters of recommendation
- Set up interview--typically during the summer months preceding fellowship start year (July to October)
- Interview with Lee Health Leadership and clinical faculty including current fellows
- Generally hear back by December 2020-Feb. 2021
- Ability to obtain Florida medical license by start of fellowship

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ACADEMIC EXPERIENCE



- Fellowship is affiliated with Florida State University

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UNIQUE ASPECTS

 - Faculty development (STFM), POCUS using residency program's V-scan ultrasounds, HIV care through PrEP clinic and working with local ID specialist.
 - Population Health curriculum
 - Opportunity to present to FSU 3rd year medical students on variety of clinical topics

 - Benefits package with Lee Health (dental, vision, health care)
 - \$500 monthly living stipend
 - \$2,000 for CME per year
 - \$5,000 for relocation expenses
 - \$500 reimbursement for electronic device used for educational purposes
 - International travel costs up to \$5,000 per year
 - Taxable \$3,000 per year housing subsidy if rent or purchase housing overseas

- All applicants receive a telephone interview with a co-director of the fellowship. Select applicants will have an extended interview by residency program director, current or past global health fellows, and select faculty.
- Final notification of accepted applicants will be January 18th.

- **Bidirectional:** 1/2 of our fellows come from underserved communities
- **Interprofessional & Interdisciplinary:** fellows range from physicians to nurses to pharmacists and beyond; US fellows from variety of training backgrounds (not just FM)
- **Rotations in the US and abroad:** both rotations are spent in true global health contexts, not in major US cities or academic centers
- **Social Justice and Health Equity Focus:** we don't come with a US-centric research agenda, but focus on solidarity with partners
- **Immersion:** Fellows spend 95% of their time immersed at partner sites
- **Partnered with Health Equity Organizations:** Our organizations are doing innovative work to move the needle toward global health equity
- **Loan Repayment Stipend:** those considered URM or first-gen to college

Time distribution - 6 months domestic and 6 months abroad, up to two locations abroad, 3 month minimum.

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Training/Curriculum: Designed to cater to fellows unique career goals. Personalized training in elective style format with many resources at VCMC.

Required Didactic - UWV Tropical Medicine, didactic teaching with VCMC residents, lead GH interest group meetings with residents, presentation at AAFP GH Summit.

Clinical Curriculum - Local work in underserved primarily latino urgent care clinic with high density of immigrant field workers. International work is site specific. Work hands-on with a former Ventura graduate living and working full time in the communities they serve.
