
Consultant/ Mentor

The *All of Us* Research Program is a historic effort to collect and study health information from one million or more people living in the United States. The program is building a diverse health information resource that can inform thousands of research studies on a variety of health conditions. *All of Us* has the powerful potential for answering important questions that are relevant to primary care.

Working in partnership with the National Institutes of Health (NIH) *All of Us* Research Program, the AAFP National Research Network (NRN) aims to increase the number of Family Medicine clinicians and researchers who actively engage with the *All of Us* Research Hub and utilize *All of Us* data both individually and collaboratively. Our goal is to develop a collaborative cohort of physicians, clinicians, and researchers of all levels who can work together to develop primary care research questions. This cohort will utilize the *All of Us* Research Hub and access data to answer those questions. We recognize that many do not currently have experience with the Research Hub, how to extract data from the platform, and how to use that data to optimally respond to primary care questions of concern.

To address this, we have developed a mentoring process designed to support junior researchers or novice family medicine clinicians who are eager to engage in research. This will allow these researchers to utilize the *All of Us* Research Hub and the rich data available to them through the life of the grant. This position comes with modest compensation.

We are thus recruiting project-specific mentors who are:

- Employed by or affiliated with an institution that has a Data Use Research Agreement (DURA) in place
- Have created a researcher workbench account
- Have completed *All of Us* Research Training (documentation required)
- Have signed the Data User Code of Conduct
- Intend to use the data within the life of the grant (until 5/1/2023) or afterward
- Are prepared to provide up to a total of 9 office hours to guide a mentee or a group through the Research hub experience and help answer any questions
- Are prepared to facilitate a group call with other mentees to address questions and concerns twice a year
- Are prepared to connect mentees to other researchers who are experienced using the *All of Us* data

- Be willing to complete the *All of Us* Media Training
- Has interacted with the Researcher Hub extensively and/or the data platform
- Be willing to provide information about your experience with the *All of Us* Program for interviews, articles, social media etc. Each Media Ambassador will be asked to provide or participate in 3 media assets or activities.
- If attending AAFP events or other research events, be willing to take *All of Us* material or opportunities to promote the *All of Us* Research Program
