Application Process

What is the timeline?

Applications will be accepted between March 15, 2021 and April 30, 2021. No exceptions. All applications must be completed and submitted by 11:59 p.m. CST, April 30. Incomplete submissions will be rejected.

Can I submit multiple abstracts for the same research study with different authors or titles?

No. Only one abstract per study is allowed.

Are encore presentations accepted?

Encore presentations are welcome only if published after January 1, 2021.

Is there a fee to apply? If selected, is there a fee to present the poster?

No, there is no application fee. If selected, all presenters or representatives with the poster must register and obtain a badge to attend FMX and view/access your poster. Do you need to submit both a short and full abstract? Should they be different?

The short abstract helps us understand your research focus, while the full abstract lets us better understand the work you have done. Our review team will use this information in their evaluation. Please include all authors in the abstracts.

For the short abstract, we want a succinct summary—maximum 250 words—of the research area(s) of focus and the outcome. The full abstract lets you expand into more details. There is no word limit. You can attach a 1- to 1½-page Word document if you are still working on your poster. Full abstracts should include background/introduction, purpose, methods, results, conclusions, and references.
