Our goal was developed to create a smaller practice feel for providers and their patients. Teams can be made up of just the faculty and residents or they can include triage nurses, LPN's, MA's and Front Office Staff that are assigned to each team. Regardless of how it's designed, how often do we all struggle with daily communication? This presentation will show ways to improve communication and team processes by physically changing clinical team seating and pulling the RN's back into direct communication with their provider team. This presentation will also show how co-location improves clinical and resident education and fosters improved working relationships.

Teaching and Living Resiliency Before, After, and During Difficult Challenging Patient Encounters

This workshop hopes to introduce to participants the concept of teaching and living resiliently before, after, and during difficult patient encounters. Burnout caused by acute/chronic stress in healthcare providers is a nationwide problem that needs to be addressed. Difficult patient encounters are estimated to occur in 15 to 30 percent of family practice visits. Understanding the provider, patient, and situational factors that contribute to challenging patient encounters will improve both patient outcomes and provider well-being. In this workshop, learners will begin to recognize and differentiate patient personality types and the appropriate behavioral approaches for assisting these patients. Learners will also be given the opportunity to practice a structured mindfulness-compassion exercise.
