

Direct Primary Care

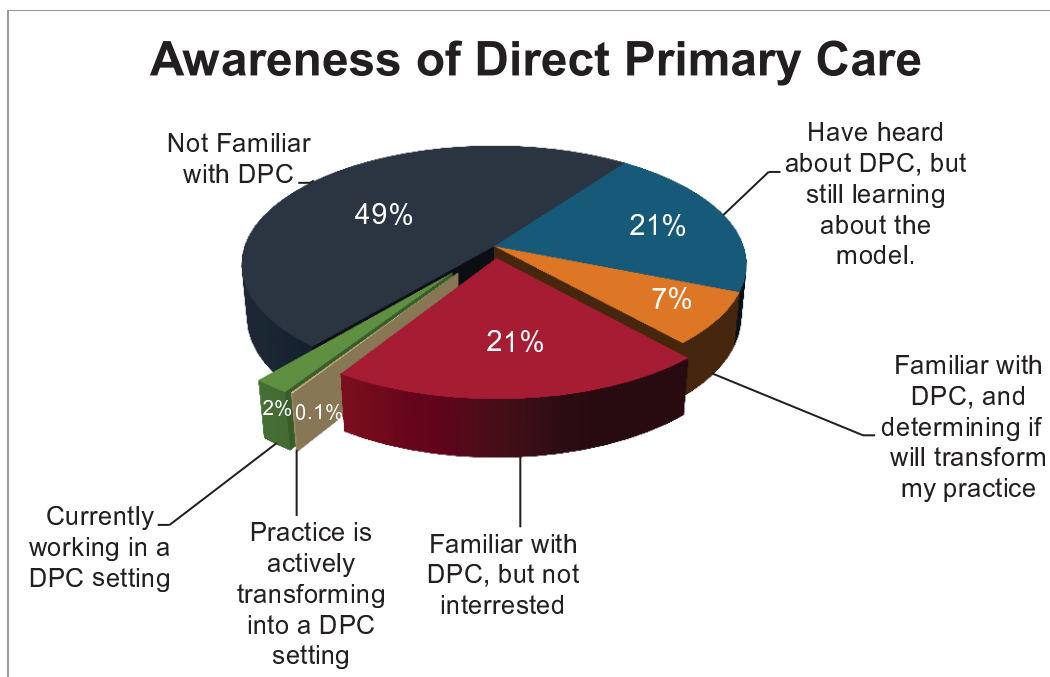


Figure 50. Awareness of the DPC model of practice.¹³

With regard to awareness of the direct primary care (DPC) model of practice (see Table 43 and Figure 50):¹³

- Half (49%) are still unfamiliar with the term *direct primary care*. This is lower than 2013 (58%).
- A very small (2%) portion is currently working in a DPC setting. This is the same as 2013 (2%).
- Two in ten respondents (21%) are familiar with DPC and have decided they are not interested in the model for their practice.
