2019 Application Details and Preview

The Primary Care Leadership Collaborative is accepting applications from family medicine student interest groups who want to participate in the 2019-2021 cohort. Before you complete the application, please review eligibility and expectations below.

Application Details

Requirements/Eligibility:

- Must be a family medicine specialty interest group at a US allopathic or osteopathic medical school, such as an FMIG or a chapter of the Student Association of the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians.
- Must have at least one faculty advisor.
- Must have at least four student leaders interested in the leadership training and program goals.
- Must intend to commit to group involvement in the program for two years.
- Student leaders must have members from at different points of training (different class years).
- Team members, including the faculty advisor, should be available for training July 24-25, 2019, in Kansas City, Mo., at the AAFP National Conference of Family Medicine Residents and Medical Students.

What to Expect In the Program:

- Eight hours of training in Relational Leadership at the AAFP National Conference of Family Medicine Residents and Medical Students.
- Monthly video conference meetings with a PCLC coach to help you apply Relational Leadership skills and leverage program resources to reach your goals.
- Four webinars each year to strengthen your skills and connect with other PCLC teams from across the country to share ideas and advice.
- Regular opportunities for faculty advisors to connect to share ideas and advice.
- Intermittent contact from PCLC administrators to gather feedback, coach, and consult.
- There is no cost to this program. However, participants should secure their own funding for travel to the AAFP National Conference.



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Application Preview

The PCLC application will ask you for the following information:

- Medical school name
- Student group name
- Faculty advisor name and email
- For confirmation that your faculty advisor is aware of the length of the program and the requirement to attend training at National Conference
- Name, email, and graduation date of student leaders (*four are required; if you have more than four leaders who would like to participate, there is not room to add them to the application, but they may join the program. Email abentley@aafp.org with the names and emails of additional students after you submit your application.*)

The PCLC application also asks for one to two paragraph responses to each of the following questions:

- Why are you applying to this program?
- What issue are you interested in advancing at your institution? Does it relate to achieving health equity, or to growing/diversifying the primary care workforce?
- What change do you hope to see at your institution?
- How could your family medicine student interest group have a bigger impact than it does today?
- How do you think you, with the support of this program, can reach your goals?
